

See How Your Lawmakers Voted

Candidates elected to the Maryland General Assembly in 2002 are nearing the end of their four-year term.

During that period, the assembly's 188 members voted on thousands of legislative proposals. Many of those measures (an estimated 6 percent of them) related directly or indirectly to Catholic Church teaching and the interests of the three Maryland-serving Catholic dioceses.

The following report was compiled by the Maryland Catholic Conference, public policy arm of Maryland's Catholic bishops. It shows how lawmakers in districts within Maryland cast their vote on key issues during the last four-year term.

Key Votes from the 2003 - 2006 Legislative Sessions

Embryonic Stem Cell Research. SB 144 (2006) authorizes the use of \$15 million of our taxes to be used for “stem cell research.” The original bill would have spent all the money on embryonic stem cell research, which is unethical because it involves the destruction of living human embryos. The Conference opposed SB 144, encouraging the legislature to instead fund ethical adult stem cell research, the only stem cell research that has actually produced treatments for patients. The bill was amended to, in theory, allow funding of both adult and embryonic stem cell research. Even after the bill was amended, the Conference opposed it, since embryonic stem cell research is morally wrong; human life is not to be treated as a commodity, as a raw material in science experiments. The bill passed the Senate 29-18, and the House, 90-48.

Cloning of Human Embryos. An attempt was made to amend the portion of HB 1 (2006) that dealt with human cloning. HB 1 (the House companion bill to SB 144) banned the birth of a cloned baby, but did not ban the creation of cloned human embryos, nor the implantation of those cloned embryos into a woman’s uterus. An amendment was offered to correct HB 1, so that it would genuinely ban cloning by prohibiting the creation of cloned human embryos. Eighty-five Delegates voted to allow the creation of human cloned embryos when the amendment was defeated by a vote of 48-85. The full Senate never got a chance to vote on the issue of creating cloned human embryos, but one Senate committee did. Conference-supported SB 160, “Human Cloning Prohibition Act of 2006,” would have banned the production of cloned human embryos. Six senators showed they are in favor of human cloning by voting against SB 160, defeating the legislation, 6-5.

Fetal Homicide. SB 349 (2004) was intended to deter violent attacks on pregnant women by allowing prosecutors to charge an attacker with homicide if, because of an assault, a woman’s unborn child is killed. The legislation would have allowed women who are robbed of

their baby to see the perpetrator brought to justice. The bill was defeated because abortion advocates turned it into a debate about abortion. The extreme position of many senators was showcased when SB 349 was essentially defeated in the Senate through the acceptance (25-22) of an amendment that deleted the entire bill and substituted a charge of first degree assault for attacking a pregnant woman. In 2005, the Conference supported similar legislation, filed in the House as HB 699. The bill was defeated when 10 members of the House committee voted “nay,” demonstrating they are opposed to protecting the rights of pregnant women to choose to bear a child.

Abortion – Parental Notice. Conference-supported HB 958 (2006) would have assisted law enforcement personnel in their efforts to stop adult males who prey on teenage girls. Seventy-four percent of girls who have intercourse before the age of 14 report having had a forced sexual experience. The bill would have ensured that parents are notified before a minor has an abortion, thus restoring parents’ rights to be involved in the health care of their minor children, and giving police the opportunity to obtain DNA samples if child sexual abuse is suspected. The bill was defeated when 11 committee members voted against parental rights, and against improving state systems to facilitate the arrest of child predators.

Abortion Funding. Both General Assembly chambers rejected identical Conference-supported budget amendments seeking to limit state Medicaid funding for abortions to those required to be funded under federal law (i.e., those performed in cases of rape or incest, or to save the life of the mother). The amendment failed in the House, 82 to 55, and in the Senate, 25 to 20.

Execution Moratorium. Identical Senate and House measures sought to impose a short-term moratorium on Maryland executions, and to establish a 16-member commission headed by Lieutenant Governor Michael Steele. The legislation charged the commission to address

racial, jurisdictional, and socioeconomic disparities in state death-penalty proceedings; the risk of executing innocents; evolving public attitudes regarding executions; and cost differences between death and life-without-parole sentences. The moratorium would remain in effect until mid-2005, providing the General Assembly sufficient time to study the commission's findings and make any necessary changes in death-penalty law. The Senate bill was defeated, 24 to 23. The House Judiciary Committee did not vote on the House version.

Over-The-Counter "Emergency Contraception." The Conference opposed legislation designed to enable a woman or girl of any age to get "emergency contraception" (*a.k.a.* "morning-after" pills) directly from a pharmacist without a doctor's visit, a prescription, or notification of a minor recipient's parents. Introduced in 2003, 2005, and 2006, the legislation failed each time in the Senate. Listed here are the 2003 House vote and the 2006 Senate vote, the most recent floor votes available.

Minimum Wage. Conference-supported legislation to increase Maryland's minimum wage by one dollar -- to \$6.15 an hour -- passed the General Assembly in 2005, but was subsequently vetoed by Governor Ehrlich. Listed here are the minimum-wage votes from 2006, when the General Assembly overrode the Governor's veto. The legislation, which took effect 30 days after the override, will raise the annual incomes of full-time minimum-wage earners by more than \$2,000 dollars, to \$12,792.

In-State Tuition for Immigrants. The Conference supported legislation to permit certain nonresident students, including the children of undocumented immigrants, to attend state universities at in-state tuition rates. The legislation passed the House and Senate in 2003, but was subsequently vetoed by Governor Ehrlich. It passed the House of Delegates again in 2004. In each of the two iterations of the legislation, students would have been eligible for in-state tuition if they completed at least three years at, and earned a diploma or its equivalent from, a Maryland high school, and if they signed an affidavit of intent to file for permanent residency upon becoming eligible to do so. The two iterations varied somewhat on other eligibility requirements. Listed here are the 2003 Senate vote and the

2004 House vote, the most recent floor votes available.

Rental Assistance for Low-Income Families. The Conference supported legislation designed to increase funding for Maryland's Rental Allowance Program (RAP), which provides grants to local governments, for rental subsidies to low-income families who are homeless, in danger of becoming homeless, or have an emergency housing need. Though reported favorably by the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee in 2006, the Senate subsequently voted to send the legislation back to committee. In addition to increasing RAP funding through a \$5 fee on the Maryland transfer tax, the legislation would have opened RAP eligibility to families with a disabled member, and allowed families to participate in the program for more than 12 months.

Teacher Scholarships. By a vote of 28-19, the Senate approved a measure to include nonpublic-school teachers in a state program providing higher education scholarships to students that agree to work in certain workforce shortage areas, including teaching, after graduation.

Textbooks and Technology. A House floor amendment introduced by Delegate Elizabeth Bobo (Dist. 12B – Howard County) sought to remove a new provision in the Nonpublic School Textbook Loan program allowing schools to acquire educational technology as well as textbooks with their program allocations. The amendment was defeated 103-30.

Marriage. The Conference opposed legislation (SB 796/HB 1021) to enable same-sex and unmarried heterosexual couples to register as "life partners" for the purpose of making critical health-care and post-mortem decisions for one another. The Conference opposed the legislation on the grounds that it eroded the image of marriage by granting "life partners" a status equivalent to married couples. Additionally, the Conference contended that properly executed legal documents, such as advance directives, are more appropriate vehicles for granting explicit medical-decision making rights. The legislation was passed by the General Assembly and vetoed by the Governor.
