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# The Mission Of Catholic Service Providers

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Catholic social teaching challenges followers of Christ to share his special concern for the poorest and most vulnerable members of society. Commitment to the “least among us” is reflected in the Catholic Church’s service to the poor, the unborn, the elderly, persons with handicapping conditions, the sick, the dying, and many other individuals in need. In his encyclical *Centesimus Annus*, Pope John Paul II reaffirms the Christian mission of service: “The Church would not be faithful to the Gospel if she were not close to the poor and if she did not defend their rights.”

At the heart of Catholic social tradition are seven key themes that illuminate the social demands of the Gospel. Those themes, described below, motivate and animate the work of the employees, volunteers, and donors who make Catholic social services possible.

**Life and Dignity of the Human Person.** Human life is sacred, and the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. Catholic social teaching is based upon belief in the sanctity of human life from conception until natural death and in the inherent dignity of every human person.

**Call to Family, Community, and Participation.** The person is not only sacred but also social. How society is organized – in economics and politics, in law and policy – directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community. The family is the central social institution, and, as such, must be supported and strengthened. Human beings grow and achieve fulfillment in community. People have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable. An important role of government and other institutions is to protect human life and dignity and promote the common good.

**Rights and Responsibilities.** Although some speak mostly of “rights” and others mostly of “responsibilities,” human dignity can be protected and a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights are protected and responsibilities are met. Therefore, every person has a fundamental right to life and to those things that make life genuinely human (*e.g.*, food, clothing, housing, health care, education, employment, and a safe environment). Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities – to one another, to our families, and to the larger society. While public debate in our nation is often divided between those who focus on personal responsibility and those who focus on social responsibilities, both are necessary to build healthy families and communities.

**Option for the Poor and Vulnerable.** In a world characterized by growing prosperity for some and pervasive poverty for others, a basic moral test is how

society's most vulnerable members are faring. In contrast to a society marred by deep divisions between rich and poor, the story of the Last Judgment (*Mt. 25:31-46*) illustrates the duty to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first.

**The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers.** The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God's creation. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected – the right to productive work, to decent and fair wages, to organize and join unions, to private property, and to economic initiative. Respecting these rights promotes an economy that protects human life, defends human rights, and advances the well-being of all.

**Solidarity.** All persons are their brothers' and sisters' keepers. Membership in the one human family is the common bond among people of every nation, race, ethnicity, religion, and economic category. Learning to practice the virtue of solidarity means learning that "loving one's neighbor" has global dimensions in an interdependent world. This virtue is described by John Paul II as "a firm and persevering determination to commit oneself to the . . . good of all and of each individual, because we are all really responsible for all." *Sollicitudo Rei Socialis*, 38.

**Care for God's Creation.** Responsible stewardship of creation demonstrates respect for the Creator. The use of resources must respect the integrity of creation and reflect a commitment to its preservation. Commitment to the common good and concern for one's neighbors and for generations yet to come require responsible stewardship of the earth.

# Maryland's Catholic Community

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The Catholic Church in Maryland includes the Archdiocese of Baltimore and parts of the Archdiocese of Washington and the Diocese of Wilmington. Together, Baltimore City and Allegany, Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, Frederick, Garrett, Harford, Howard, and Washington counties comprise the Archdiocese of Baltimore. In addition to the District of Columbia, the Archdiocese of Washington encompasses Calvert, Charles, Montgomery, Prince George's, and St. Mary's counties. The Diocese of Wilmington extends beyond Delaware into Maryland's Eastern Shore, including Caroline, Cecil, Dorchester, Kent, Queen Anne's, Somerset, Talbot, Wicomico, and Worcester counties.

Together, the three dioceses include over 1.2-million Catholics, the vast majority of whom live in Maryland. Throughout the state, the dioceses enhance the lives of

Marylanders of all faiths through the social services they provide. Individually, many of the 282 Catholic parishes in Maryland provide food, clothing, and other assistance to those in need in their local communities. On a broader scale, Catholic service agencies within the three dioceses offer specialized help in health care, adoption, foster care, job training, immigration services, and many other areas.

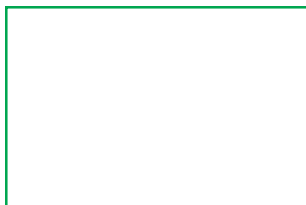
# Catholic Social Services in Maryland

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Maryland’s extensive Catholic social-service network helps provide a safety net for individuals and families who struggle to meet basic needs. For example, in Baltimore City alone, fiscal 2002 statistics show that Our Daily Bread served 264,426 meals, and Samaritan Center provided assistance with utilities, rent, transportation, and other critical needs to 27,762 people. In 2001, the eight Catholic hospitals serving Maryland assisted over 1.6-million people. In the same year, Church-affiliated homes for senior citizens served approximately 4,700 individuals, and immigration legal services provided through Catholic Charities served over 3,800 people.

In all, a network of more than 280 Catholic agencies and institutions serve individuals and families needing assistance throughout Maryland. Woven throughout their work in diverse settings, geographic regions, and areas of expertise is a shared commitment to “the least among us.” By helping the poor, the unborn, the homeless, the sick, the dying, and others in most need of assistance, Catholic social-service providers transform social teaching into concrete practice. 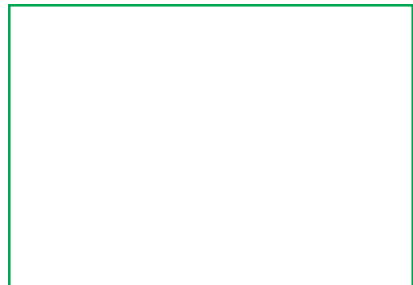

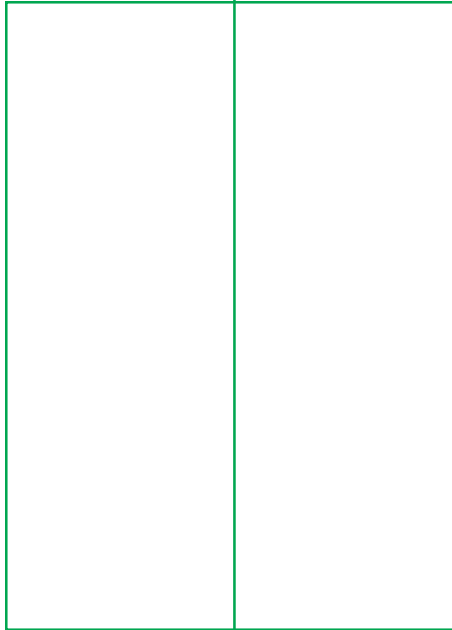

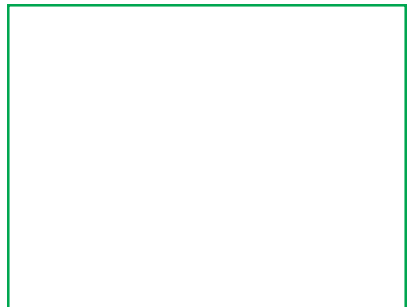
